Activities for All



On THE ROAD TO SUCCESS Teen Pathways to Brighter Futures helped our teens:

- Learn valuable on the job training through internships, setting them up for future success.
- Increase SAT scores and better prepare for the college application process.
- Improve emotional awareness and ability to discuss their thoughts and feelings.



100 Teens were trained in Teen Mental Health First Aid!



83% of participants were confident in their capacity to identify mental health and wellness resources for themselves or a peer to use, and were confident that they could use the resources to assist a peer in navigating a stressful situation.



100% of participants noted improvements in taking care of their own mental health and wellness, and 66% demonstrated improved knowledge about mental health stigma and awareness.



85% of teens reported it was important to them to have a safe place to have open discussions with their peers.



100% of businesses highly recommended our internship program.



90% of teens in our workforce development program reported improved communication skills.



98% of teens learned skills that helped prepare them for their first job.

Dover Preschool

We are thrilled to have officially opened our doors to our four new preschool classrooms on October 6, 2023!

- Established a brand new team of certified educators, with 90% being bilingual.
- Cultivated a strong rapport with the Dover community through active participation in local events, fostering valuable connections for potential collaborations. These collaborations offer essential services to the families we support, including parenting resources, emergency food assistance, financial literacy programs, and more.
- Hosted the first ever "sneaker ball" for over 175 district families!



Morristown Preschool

- Opened an eighth preschool classroom allowing us to serve 125 little ones.
- Hosted monthly book clubs for over 60 parents and children to promote early literacy
- Partnered with the Madison YMCA to offer water safety lessons over the summer to our 4 and 5 year olds.





100% of preschoolers engaged in problemsolving and exploration to foster critical thinking skills.



98% of first time preschoolers show improved social skills and interactions with peers through cooperation, sharing and conflict-resolution.



100% of students received healthy nutritious meals each day.



100% of preschoolers who graduated had a smooth transition to Kindergarten.

Summer Camp

- 190 happy campers joined us for 8 weeks of nonstop summer fun!
- Epic adventures included trips to Funplex, Splashplex, Battlezone, Imagine That, The Morris Museum, Grow-A-Row, Liberty Science Center, and Macculloch Hall!
- Three Morris School District teachers helped our campers keep their reading skills sharp and avoid the summer slip.
- Bonus excitement was brought to camp with The Gagashpere, Lizard Guys, a bounce house and an obstacle course!



100% of campers reported having FUN!



90% of our campers said the field trips were the best part of camp.



95% of campers reported making new friends.



85% of campers reported learning new skills through sports, arts & crafts and enrichment opportunities.



Before/After School



- 122 K-5th grade students participated in our before & afterschool program engaging in homework assistance, enrichment, arts, mentorship, and recreation opportunities.
- 4th & 5th grade students participated in the NSBE Jr. STEM Engineering program in partnership with the Morris County Chapter of the Links Inc.
- Kindergarteners engaged in Music Theatre with teaching artists from Mayo Performing Arts Center.
- 3rd graders received violin lessons from the Lakeland Youth Symphony Orchestra.
- 15 students received a mentor from Delbarton to work with throughout the school year in our Big Brothers Bright Futures initiative.
- Students celebrated the World Cup with our very own in-house competition and watch party!

Recreation

- 100+ participants joined us in Open Gym!
- 75+participants on average came out every Friday night for Youth Night!
- 60 players participated in our fall and spring soccer sessions.
- The Boyz to Men program built a community for 25 middle school boys to learn basic cooking skills and how to get in touch with their emotions.
- Unity Steppers wowed the community with over 25 local performances!





90% of youth in Boyz to Men reported improved responsibility.



85% of youth in Boyz to Men reported increased self-esteem.



95% of Unity Steppers were on honor roll or high honor roll.



100% of participants in Open Gym had a safe place to play ball!

Social Adult Day Center

Our Social Adult Day Center is a lifeline for our aging community, offering companionship and support to **84 seniors aged 63-100 in 2023.** Whether they live independently, with a spouse, or with family, our center provides a welcoming space for everyone—from active seniors seeking purpose to those needing some assistance or in the early stages of decline. We create a vibrant community through engaging activities, shared meals, and meaningful connections. By caring for our seniors, we also give family caregivers the chance to rest and recharge.





100 % of participating families report that the Center allows them to achieve a "better level of care" for their loved one while resulting in greatly reduced stress for the caregiver.



88 % of caregivers also report more time to focus on their personal and professional development or otherwise care for themselves.




